RESOLUTION NO. 568

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN LUIS, ARIZONA, AMENDING SANITATION COLLECTION RATES AND CHARGES, PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE FOR SAID CHARGES, REPEALING ANY CONFLICTING PROVISIONS, PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the City of San Luis, Arizona operates the sanitation collection system of the City as an enterprise fund;

WHEREAS, said funds have been deficient in its revenues and creates a condition wherein general revenue funds are used to subsidize the account;

WHEREAS proper savings for capital expenditures have not occurred, creating a condition threatening even greater deficiencies in the future;

WHEREAS the proposed changes in rates are in accordance with a rate study conducted in 2003; and

WHEREAS there is an immediate need to correct these deficiencies so that proper financial planning and budgeting for fiscal year 2004/2005 may occur,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the City of San Luis, Arizona as follows:

Section 1: Sanitation Collection Rates beginning September 1, 2004 shall be as follows:

- a. The rate for Residential 95 gallon collection is set at \$10.90 per month.
- b. The rate for Senior Citizens is set at \$5.00 per month.

c. The rate for Commercial 95 gallon collection is set at \$16.40 per month.

d. The rate for Commercial 3 Yard collection is set at \$75.60 per month.

e. The rate for Commercial 4 Yard collection is set at \$109.00 per month.

f. The rate for Commercial 6 Yard collection is set at \$151.00 per month.

g. The rate for Commercial 8 Yard collection is set at \$202.00 per month.

h. The rate for 300 gallon collection is set at \$42.00 per month.

i. The rate for Schools is the same as for commercial.

Section 2: Sanitation Collection Rates beginning October 1, 2005 shall be as follows:

a. The rate for Residential 95 gallon collection is set at \$11.95 per month.

b. The rate for Senior Citizens is set at \$5.00 per month.

c. The rate for Commercial 95 gallon collection is set at \$19.65 per month.

d. The rate for Commercial 3 Yard collection is set at \$90.75 per month.

e. The rate for Commercial 4 Yard collection is set at \$131.00 per month.

f. The rate for Commercial 6 Yard collection is set at \$181.00 per month.

g. The rate for Commercial 8 Yard collection is set at \$242.00 per month.

h. The rate for 300 gallon collection is set at \$50.00 per month.


i. The rate for Schools is the same as for commercial.

Section 3: In the event of a conflict between the provisions of this resolution and any other ordinance, resolution, regulation, or policy of the City of San Luis, the conflicting provisions are hereby repealed, superceded, and replaced, and the provisions of this resolution shall govern.

Section 4: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this resolution is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the final decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this resolution.

Section 5: Whereas, it is immediately necessary for the preservation of the peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of San Luis, Arizona, and for further reason that the services to the citizens of the City of San Luis may be provided in the most efficient manner possible without interruption in service, as well as financial considerations, and that the best interest of the City require the amendments to go into immediate effect, an emergency is declared to exist, and this resolution shall become immediately operative and in force and effect from and after its passage and adoption.


