

RESOLUTION OF THE 108
IN SUPPORT OF PROPOSITION 300

- WHEREAS, the street and highway system throughout Yuma County has deteriorated seriously and is in need of extensive maintenance and reconstruction; and
- WHEREAS, financial resources available to the county, cities and towns for maintaining and continuing to improve the road system are severely limited by the needs of rapid growth, rising labor and material costs and decreasing conventional revenue sources; and
- WHEREAS, today's street and highway system in Yuma County needs some 216 million dollars to meet minimum roadway requirements and an additional 40 million dollars over a 10-year period to properly maintain these improvements; and
- WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Arizona has signed H.B. 2306 enabling counties to create a new revenue source without undue financial hardship to county residents and businesses or the sacrifice of other essential programs; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to the new legislation, the Board of Supervisors of Yuma County has determined to submit to the voters Proposition 300 on January 28, 1986, which if passed will establish a 1/2 cent sales tax in Yuma County, all proceeds of which will be used for the repair and reconstruction of streets, highways and bridges throughout Yuma County and for the purchase of right of way and construction of new roadways; and
- WHEREAS, the Yuma County Board of Supervisors has asked the Yuma Metropolitan Planning Organization to make recommendations on which projects are to be funded with the 1/2 cent sales tax revenues; and
- WHEREAS, the Yuma Metropolitan Planning Organization has adopted procedures for developing recommendations for expenditure of the 1/2 cent sales tax revenues; and
- WHEREAS, the health, welfare and safety of the citizens of Yuma County will be best served by the use of such funds to establish a safe and efficient system of streets and highways in Yuma County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE Mayor and Council, THAT: The Town of San Luis endorses and supports the Yuma Metropolitan Planning Organization's procedures for developing recommendations on expenditure of the 1/2 cent sales tax revenues; and FURTHERMORE, the Town of San Luis endorses, supports, and encourages the passage of Proposition 300, asking the voters of the Town of San Luis to approve a 1/2 cent sales tax to fund road, bridge and street improvements county-wide, which will give Yuma County and the municipalities located therein the financial capacity to fund the improvements necessary for the health, welfare, and safety of the residents throughout Yuma County.

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF
SAN LUIS, ARIZONA IN SUPPORT OF
PROPOSITION 300.

WHEREAS, Yuma County's street and highway system has seriously deteriorated and is in need of extensive reconstruction; and

WHEREAS, Yuma County's financial resources for providing a proper road system are severely limited by the needs of rapid growth, rising labor and material costs and decreasing conventional revenue sources; and

WHEREAS, today's County street system needs some 160 million dollars to meet minimum roadway requirements and an additional 40 million dollars over a 10-year period to properly maintain these improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature has passed legislation enabling counties to create a new revenue source without undue financial hardship to county residents and businesses or the sacrifice of other essential programs; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the new legislation, the Board of Supervisors of Yuma County has determined to submit to the voters Proposition 300, which if passed will establish a $\frac{1}{2}$ cent sales tax in Yuma County, all proceeds of which will be used for the construction and reconstruction of streets, highways and bridges in Yuma County and for the purchase of right of way and construction of new roadways; and

WHEREAS, the health, welfare and safety of the citizens of Yuma County will be best served by the use of such funds to establish a safe and efficient system of streets and highways in Yuma County;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF SAN LUIS, ARIZONA THAT:
