A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN LUIS SETTING COMPENSATION TO BE PAID TO MEMBERS OF COUNCIL; ESTABLISHING EFFECTIVE DATE; REPEALING ANY CONFLICTING PROVISIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY

Whereas, A.R.S. §9-232.01 provides that the council may, by ordinance or resolution, proscribe a salary to be paid to the mayor and members of council;

Whereas, §30.024 of the San Luis City Code provides that the compensation of elected officers of the city shall be fixed from time to time by resolution of the Council;

Whereas, more than a decade has passed since salaries of members of Council were adjusted;

Whereas, all Members of City Council are presently eligible for city health insurance benefits as eligible city employees;

Whereas, all Members of City Council are presently eligible for the Elected Officials Retirement Plan of the State of Arizona;

Whereas, as the City has grown and the issues before the City have become more complex, the duties of office have increased; and

Whereas, a review of salaries paid to members of the councils of similarly sized municipalities in Arizona reveal that an adjustment is justified;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the City of San Luis, Arizona, as follows:

Section 1: The monthly salary to be paid to the Mayor and Members of the City Council shall be as follows:

- a. The office of Mayor shall be paid the sum of \$1,750 per month;
- b. The office of Vice Mayor shall be paid the sum of \$1,300 per month;

c. The office of Council Member shall be paid the sum of \$900 per month.

Section 2: The Mayor, Vice-Mayor, and Members of City Council shall be eligible for city health insurance benefits as eligible city employees.

Section 3: The Mayor, Vice-Mayor, and Members of City Council shall be entitled to be eligible for the Elected Officials Retirement Plan of the State of Arizona.

Section 4: The effective date of this resolution shall be January 1, 2015.

Section 5: In the event of a conflict between the provisions of this Resolution and any other ordinance, resolution, regulation, or policy of the City of San Luis, the conflicting provisions are hereby repealed, superseded, and replaced, and the provisions of this Resolution shall govern.

Section 6: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Resolution is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the final decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Resolution.
