

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF SAN LUIS, ARIZONA, AMENDING THE SAN LUIS CODE BY ADDING SECTION 7-13-12 TO ARTICLE 7-3 OF THE SAN LUIS CODE; REQUIRING A BUSINESS LICENSE FEE FOR CONDUCTING THE BUSINESS OF EXCHANGE OR SALE OF MEXICAN PESOS AND AMERICAN DOLLARS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF SAN LUIS, ARIZONA AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1.

The San Luis Code Section 7-3-12 is hereby amended as follows:

Section 7-3-12. Money Exchange Business: It shall be unlawful for any person engaged in the business of exchanging or selling Mexican Pesos and/or American Dollars to conduct such business on the streets, sidewalks, or rights-of-way of San Luis, Arizona.

Such business must be conducted within the confines of a building conforming in all aspects to the latest Uniform Building Code adopted by the Town Council, and in conformance with Town zoning regulations.

Section 2. Definition:

Money Exchange Business is a commercial business of exchanging or selling Mexican pesos and/or American Dollars. This is either the sole or primary economic gain of said business.

Other commercial business establishments in Town may exchange or sell pesos without being designated as a "Money Exchange Business" when their volume of monetary exchange is but a minor portion of their total business.

Section 3. Business License Fee:

Businesses identified as a Money Exchange Business must apply at Town Hall for a Business License and pay a \$500.00 per year fee.

Section 4.

Violation of any section of this ordinance shall constitute cause for revocation of their business license.
