

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL
OF THE TOWN OF SAN LUIS, AZ. IDENTIFYING
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND HOUSING NEEDS AND
ACTIVITIES TO BE UNDERTAKEN TO MEET SUCH
NEEDS.

WHEREAS, Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended through the Housing and Urban-Rural Recovery Act of 1983, states that the primary objective of the Title and of the community development program of each grantee is the "development of viable urban communities by providing decent housing and a suitable living environment and expanding economic opportunities, principally for persons of low and moderate income..."; and

WHEREAS Section 106(d) (2) (D) requires the Governor of each state to certify that each unit of general local government to be distributed funds will identify its community development and housing needs, including the needs of low and moderate income persons, and the activities to be undertaken to meet such needs.







If approved and sold, the bonds are payable solely from revenues derived from taxes, fees, charges and other moneys collected by the State of Arizona and returned to the Town for street and highway purposes pursuant to law, which have not been theretofore specifically allocated and pledged for the payment of any other indebtedness of the Town, such highway user taxes as are necessary to pay principal of and interest on the bonds sought to be issued will be irrevocably appropriated for the purpose of paying such principal and interest.

The purpose of the election is to permit the qualified electors of the Town to vote on the question of whether Town of San Luis, Arizona Street and Highway User Revenue Bonds, Project of 1985, in the maximum principal amount of \$1,200,000 should be issued and sold, in one or more series, pursuant to Title 9, Chapter 6, Article 5, Arizona Revised Statutes, and all amendments thereto, the proceeds of which shall be used for the purpose of (1) improvement, construction, reconstruction, acquisition of rights-of-way or maintenance of Town streets and highways including all incidental and related items in connection therewith, and (2) paying all necessary legal, financial consultant, engineering and contingent costs connected therewith. The bonds are to bear interest at a rate not to exceed thirteen percent (13%) per annum from the date of their issuance, said interest payable semiannually on the first day of January and the first day of July of each year until the maturity of each bond of each series and said bonds to mature over a period of not to exceed twenty (20) years from the date of issuance of each series and said bonds to mature on the
